CITY OFFICIAL AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

- A. Deputy City Clerk – Lori Stone stated there was nothing to report.
- B. Accounting Manager- Bill Lehmann stated there was nothing to report
- C. Chief of Police - William LaGrand stated there was nothing to report.
- D.  City Attorney - Robert E. Jones stated the City's appointed provisional Judge Todd Hamby, has changed firms and in order for him to take the City's business to the new firm a form must be signed by the Mayor. Alderman Bersche made a motion to authorize Mayor Fribis to sign. Alderman Baebler seconded the motion and was unanimously approved.

On April 15, 2016 Attorney Jones presented an argument regarding the St. Louis County Police take over bill. The argument was well received by the court and is now under review. Attorney Jones stated that there should be a ruling within week or two and he will let the board know as soon he hears something.

Proposition B- the City has been notified by the Department of Revenue that several steps need to be taken in order to continue collecting out of state motor vehicle tax. DOR requested a copy of the original ballot, copy of certified election results; opinion letter from the attorney indicating that the language is consistent with the statute, and a new ordinance to be passed by the Board of Alderman indicating that the tax will continue to be collected. Attorney Jones stated he would like to bring this back to the Board of Alderman's May 10th meeting.

St. Louis County Municipal League is sponsoring a newly elected official conference tomorrow at Maryland Heights, at 4 pm. Presentations will be given by Pat Kelly, the executive director and members of Curtis, Heintz, Garrett & O'Keefe will speak on various topics for newly elected officials.

E. City Engineer - Bryson Baker addressed changing some of the meetings with in the City. The second Tuesday of the month is Board of Aldermen meeting; fourth Tuesday is the Board of Aldermen work session. Planning & Zoning meeting is prior to the Board meeting. This does not allow enough time for discussion before the next Board meeting. The staff is discussing the possibility with Planning and Zoning their meeting to the third Wednesday, (which is a week before the work session) in order for the Board to address the issues from Planning & Zoning at the work session and then on the agenda for the Board meeting on the following month. Mr. Baker indicated that he would welcome feedback on the concept.

F. Director of Parks & Recreation - Gerald Brown stated that the leak in the Lazy River had been fixed. Earth Day went very well. Cleanup from the flood water is at 95%. Both parks are open.

G. GO Committee- Alderman Baebler expressed a BIG thank you to Gerald Brown and staff for a glitch free Earth Day event. The City collected 17,214 pounds of paint, a record. Recycling lines went smoothly. The bicycle project was well organized by Danny Searcy working toward his Eagle Scout project. Alderman Baebler stated that Danny Searcy will be honored at the May board meeting.

H. Treasurer/Collector – Michael Sawicki was not present.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

FINANCE COMMITTEE – Mayor Fribis stated at the March 28 meeting, there was an update on the potential flood buyout program. At this time the City has not heard back from the State regarding funds being made available, and nothing has been budgeted. Staff is continuing a positive approach in response to the Standard & Poor's rating review. Plans for the kickoff meeting with Tyler Technology, the new financial software provider, is moving forward. Mr. Lehmann provided an update on the use of procurement cards, and some positive changes were made. Due to the Standard & Poor's review, The Capital Improvement committee will be working to update the five year Capital Improvement Plan annually. The Finance Committee work calendar is still being reviewed and updated. Mayor Fribis stated Mr. Lehmann reported on an investment that needs to be sold. It is a group benefit insurance policy that converted to a publically traded company. It's not an investment the City normally has, so it is recommended that the City sell it. The market value is approximately \$23,000.00 and it will be voted on later this evening.

Mayor Fribis stated at the April 25 meeting a representative, Mr. Scott James of JW Terrill presented the Delta Dental insurance policy for our employees. The Committee voted on a recommendation that will be on the May Board of Alderman agenda. There were no changes in the flood buyout issue. The new software from Tyler Technology will be in place by October 1 or November 1 of this year. The City has approximately \$2.3 million in a money market account. Mr. Lehmann has contacted Mr. Lukens of the Arbitrage Management for a possible investment to earn more money. Next finance meeting is May 23 at 5:30 pm in the Public Works board room with the new finance chairman to be elected later this evening.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE – Alderman Gau stated there was nothing to report.

PARKS & RECREATION COMMITTEE – Alderman Kostial stated this past weekend on community day at Claire GEMPP nature preserve conservation area, there were volunteers that cleared two large areas. Pool opening is May 27 and more to come on the activities at the pool. The shelter at Lime Stone Park was delayed due to weather and completion is anticipated around June 1. The City is taking bids on a project to relocate the front desk at the Community Center. There is a board meeting tomorrow that is open to the public.

PERSONNEL COMMITTEE – Alderman Baebler stated nothing to report.

POLICE ADVISORY BOARD - Alderman Bersche stated at the last meeting the Advisory Board discussed ways to engage in the Community on public safety issues. This will be ongoing discussion at the next meeting.

PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE – Alderman Musich stated that the Committee met on April 7, and discussed sewer issues regarding homes on Forest Path. Ongoing collaborations between the residents of Forest Path, Sunset Hills and MSD will remain until this issue is resolved. Discussions continued on the City Hall enhancements regarding security concerns both on the public works side and the city administration side. Discussions will continue until the work is completed. The public works department received a proposal from Oates Associates for \$59,200.00. The budget for this project is \$60,000 and the public works committee recommends approval.

Mr. Jones stated there is a resolution on the agenda for this project. It is one of the five resolutions under new business tonight.

Alderman Musich stated the Handley Hill road improvement project was discussed and the public works staff negotiated a contract with HR Green to develop conceptual plan for roadway, drainage impacts and right of ways.

Alderman Musich stated the concrete slab project also was discussed and four bids were received. Bids ranged from \$310,032 down to \$223,850. The staff recommends M&H Concrete as the lowest and best bid for this project in the amount of \$223,850.

Alderman Musich stated flood issues were also discussed, they city has spent \$35,000 in material and services for cleanup. The Eddie & Park Sidewalk Project will be built along the north side of Eddie & Park from Robyn to the dog park. The city has received five bids ranging from \$164,288.00 down to \$123,646.00. The Public Works Committee recommends Spencer Construction as the lowest and best bid for this project in the amount of \$123,645.00. The budget for this project is \$200,000.

Alderman Musich stated the next meeting for the Public Works Committee is May 5, 2016 at 6pm in the Public Works conference room.

WEBSITE COMMITTEE – Alderman Baebler stated there was nothing to report.

Summary:

This application is for a Final Development Plan to redevelop property located at 10300 Watson Road. The property is located on the south side of Watson Road, approximately .27 mile east of South Lindbergh Boulevard and is also known as the Color Art building. The property is currently zoned PD-LC(B) Planned Development - Limited Commercial, 1-3 acre lot size. The properties to the north (across Watson

Road) east and west are zoned C-1. The properties to the south are zoned R-4, Single Family Residential 10,000 square foot minimum lot size.

Recent applications:

P-21-15 was a petition to rezone the property from C-1 Commercial District to PD-LC(B) Planned Development - Limited Commercial, 1-3 acre lot size. It was approved in September 2015.

P-22-15 was a petition for Text Amendment to add "Indoor storage facilities" as a conditional use in the C-1 Commercial District. It was approved in September 2015.

P-23-15 was a petition for Preliminary Development Plan for the property. It was also approved in September 2015 with the following conditions:

1. Petitioner shall post a resident caretaker/watchman on the premises 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.
2. Petitioner shall demonstrate approval from MoDOT for landscaping buffer in the right of way of Watson Road.
3. There shall be no retail sales from the storage stalls.

A-11-15 was a petition to vary the side setback requirement, buffer width and site coverage allowed. The Board of Adjustment approved that petition in July 2015.

Staff analysis:

The petitioner is proposing to redevelop this property, using the existing structure and parking lot. The structure will be used for indoor storage, office space and caretaker's residence.

There has been one change made to the plan subsequent to the approval of the Preliminary Development Plan. All vehicular access to the structure will now be on the front of the building.

The petitioner is proposing to use MoDOT right of way to meet the buffer requirement along Watson Road. The applicant has provided written agreement from MoDOT, allowing the petitioner to use the right of way for landscaping purposes.

This Final Development Plan is the last step in the process for redevelopment of this property. The Final Development Plan process requires action by the Board of Aldermen and the Mayor. If approved, the Final Development Plan must be recorded with St Louis County.

FINDINGS OF FACT
