MINUTES

A motion to approve the minutes of the August 21, 2018 Police Advisory Board meeting, as distributed, was made by Mr. Finney and seconded by Mr. Epperson. The motion passed unanimously.

SPEAKER --- SGT ROBBIE HAGEN, C.O.R.E Officer/Public Information Officer

Sgt. Hagen presented details regarding some of her community engagement efforts which included attendance at the St. Lucas UCC Community Meals, an Active Shooter presentation, participation in The Sheridan at Laumeier and Old Navy Safety events, safety presentations to the students at the St. Lucas UCC Preschool, a booth at the SunCrest Fest and a presentation to the Rotary Club regarding current events in the Police Department. Sgt. Hagen said she would be presenting Active Shooter training to the department's Communications personnel this month, so they are familiar with what the public is taught, to train them for an event within the Police Department building and to reinforce their existing training for these types of incidents. The establishment of a Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) with the Crestwood Police Department is in the preliminary formative stage.

Chief Dodge said there were no safety or security related issues at the SunCrest Fest or the recent Bicycle Cruise.

Chief Dodge provided information regarding the recent Armed Robbery at Cricket Wireless. In addition, Chief Dodge informed the committee that he has tried to contact the owner of the Holiday Inn regarding security measures, in particular security cameras on the parking lots, at the hotel due to a couple of recent incidents of vehicles broken into on the hotel parking lot. Chief Dodge said he left several messages for the owner of the property, but had not yet received a return phone call.

As a follow up to Mr. Bersche's suggestion, at the August meeting, that residents be encouraged to install security cameras on the outside of their homes, Sgt. Hagen said that a list of companies that install residential security cameras has been compiled and she is working on suggested guidelines for how to select a system. Sgt. Hagen said the information will be posted on the Police Department's website when the project is completed.

Mr. Bersche made a motion to adjourn; the motion was seconded by Mr. Finney. The motion passed unanimously and the meeting adjourned at 6:45 PM.
