CORP is one of three programs within the Office of Family and Community Services – a division of the Saint Louis County Department of Human Services. The other two programs are: County Youth Programs, and Veterans Programs.

CORP provides a variety of programs, services, and volunteer opportunities for Saint Louis County residents age 60 and over. Most programs and services are free of charge, however, donations are accepted for all services.

CORPs neighborhood-based staff and volunteers are eager to provide you with the services and opportunities you need to maintain an independent lifestyle.

CORP's Aging Services Academy is a program for adults 50+ for computer technology/gerontology training, internships and volunteer experiences in the aging field.

CORP CONNECTIONS

N EIGHBOR DRIVING NEIGHBOR - volunteer drivers using their own vehicles transport older adults to and from medical appointments and other essential business. Donations accepted.

C ARE CALLS - volunteers call homebound older adults regularly to check on their well being or visit an older adult in their home to chat, read, play a game or be a friend.

C AREGIVER TO CAREGIVER—trained volunteers visit with homebound elderly so primary caregivers can take a break.

C ARING CONNECTIONS— volunteers will recognize birthdays, do minor home chores or help with special projects in the homes of older adults.

L EGAL ASSISTANCE - volunteer attorneys prepare simple wills, quit claim deeds, and other legal documents.

T AX ASSISTANCE - trained volunteers prepare state and federal tax forms in season and provide year-around assistance with the Missouri Property Tax Rebate (Circuit Breaker).

C ARING SHOPPERS—Assist older adults with their shopping needs.

F ORMS ASSISTANCE - trained volunteers help complete medical and insurance claim forms.

H OME CARE & REPAIR - referrals to skilled workers for help with minor home repairs and in-home services (fees negotiated between customer and worker). Free locks and smoke detectors available for low income customers.

F ILE OF LIFE—plastic file container for important medical information.

I NFORMATION & REFERRAL - referrals to additional community resources.

S ERVICE OPPORTUNITIES for civic and business groups, college and university students (internships and practicum).
